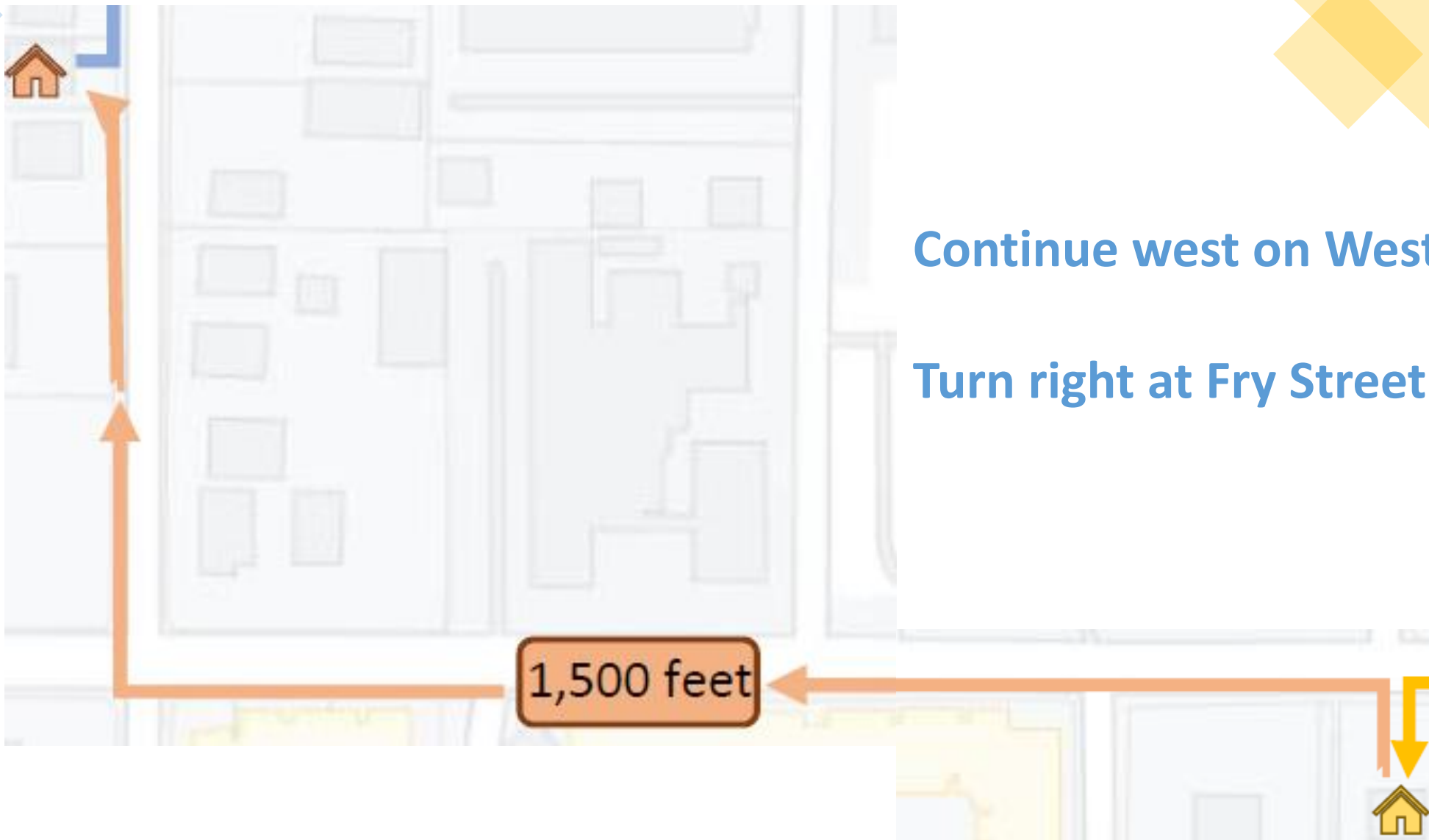

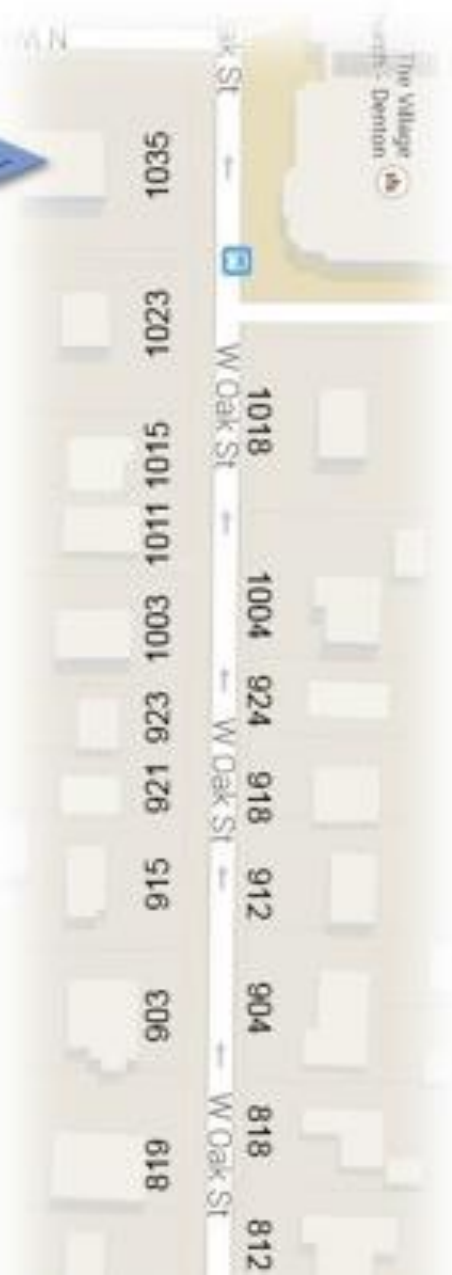


**Continue west on West Oak,

Built in 1903 by Frank Craft for Mary and Robert Evers, merchants of the Evers Hardware store in the middle of the south side of the Square

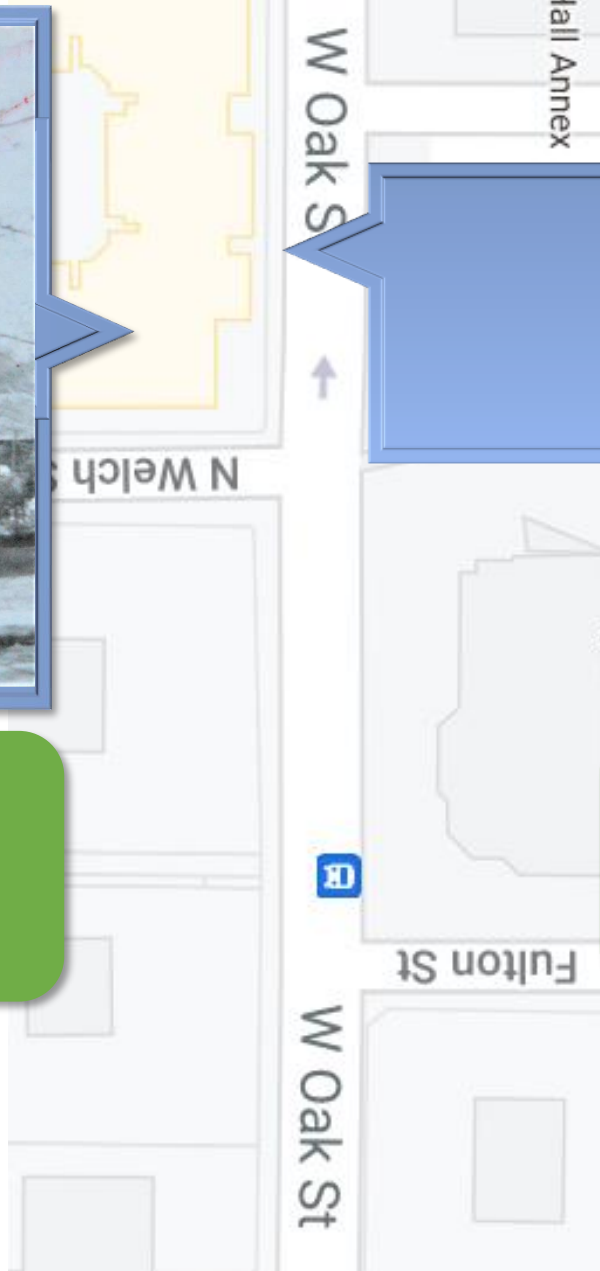
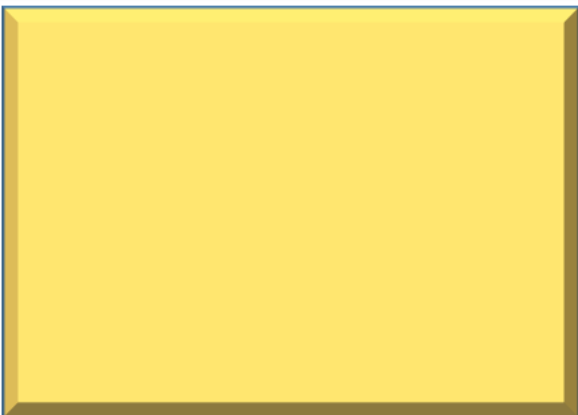

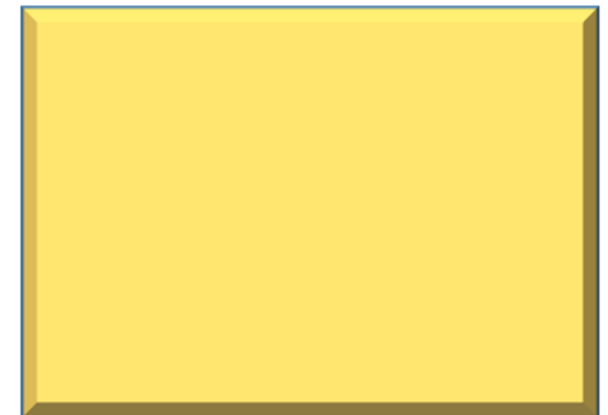
1123 West Oak – D. R. Malone House

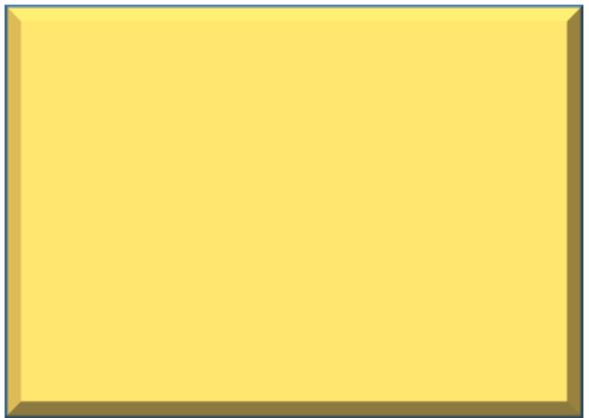

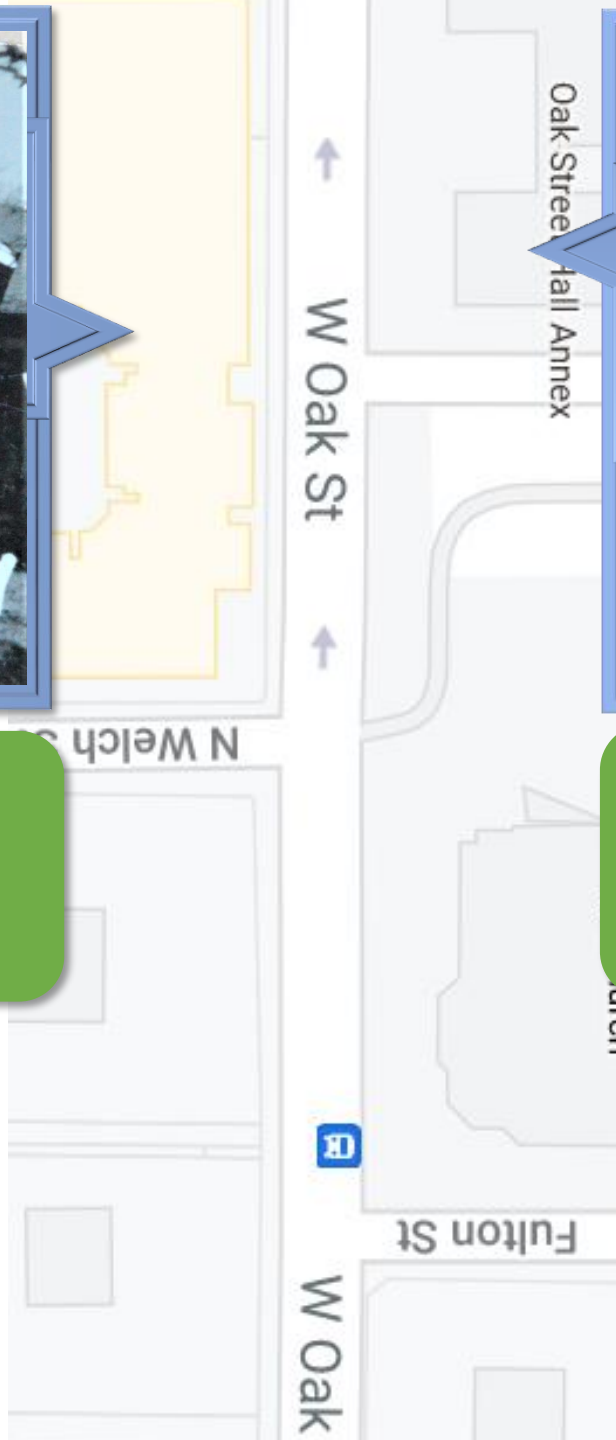
1215 West Oak – L. E. Preston House
Built 1924

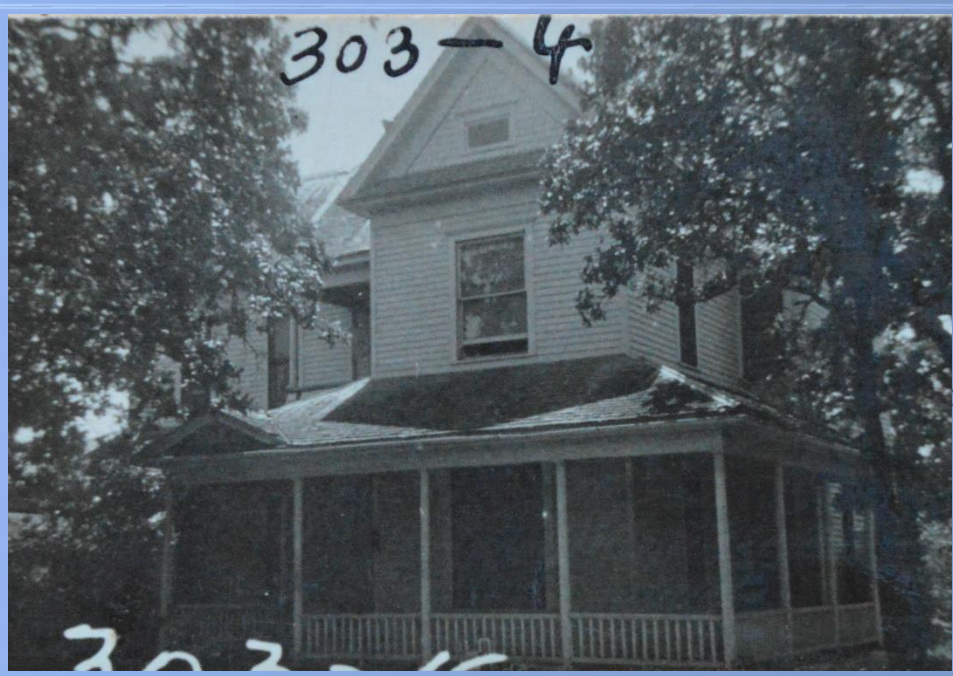

Land used to build first female dormitory

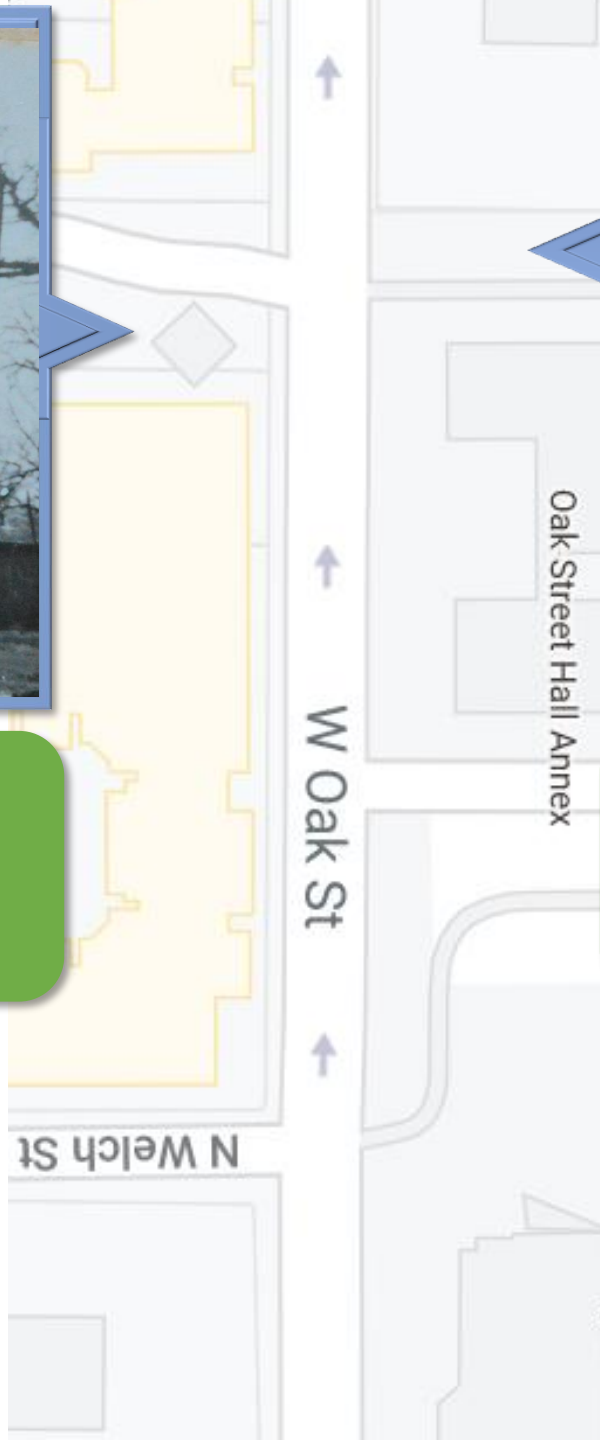
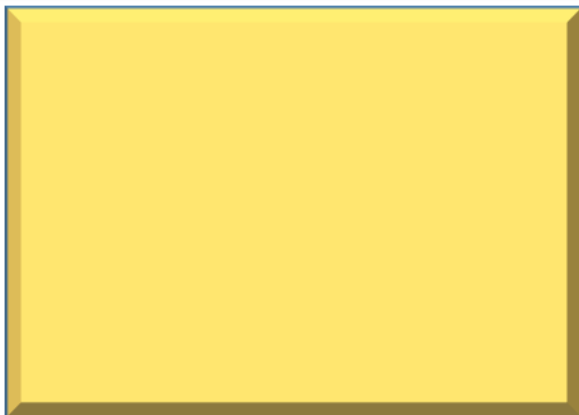

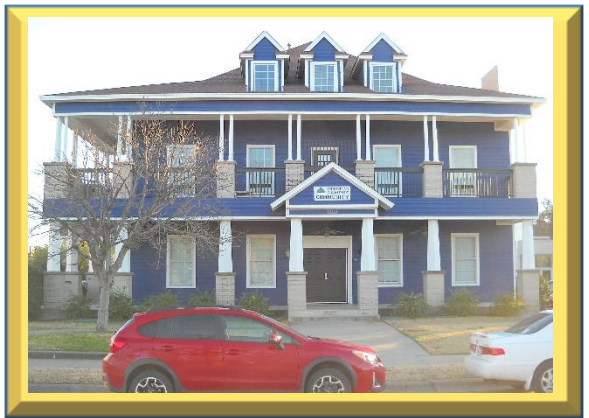

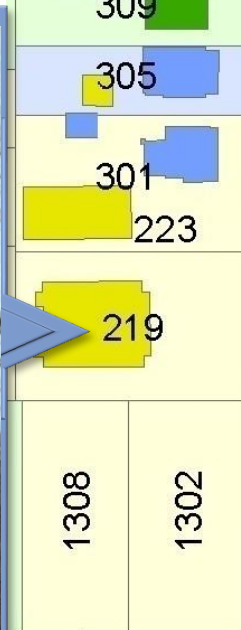
1305 West Oak – Pearl McCracken House, 1912

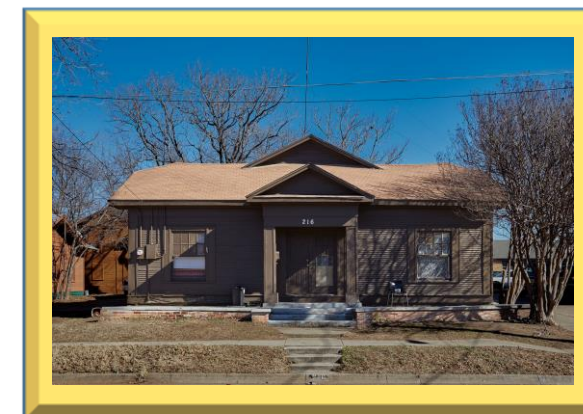

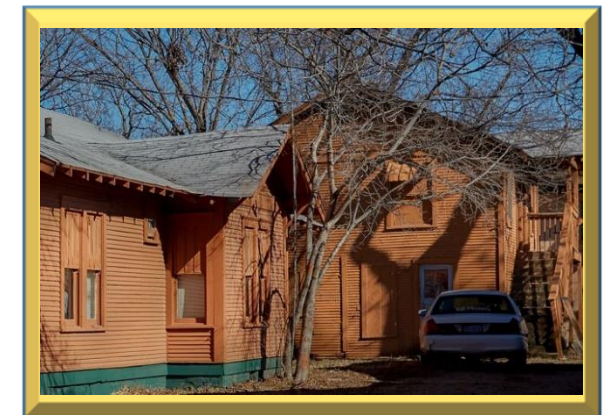

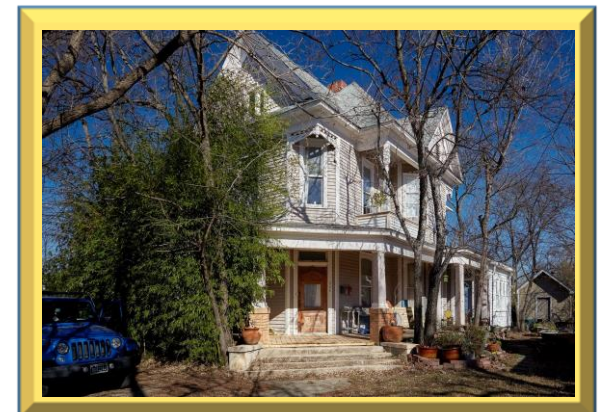
